

ADA lawsuits – small business targeted

According to <u>data</u> collected by the law firm Seyfarth Shaw, ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) lawsuits have increased by 320% since 2013 and website ADA legal demands were expected to reach 10,000 per week by the end of 2022*.

Many of these lawsuits are brought against small businesses who are specifically targeted because they have limited means to defend themselves. Law firms know that many don't have the time or resources to take a lawsuit through litigation and will likely pay to settle the case.
